

It bears the following inscription in the handwriting of Thomas Jefferson: Thomas Jefferson gives this writing-desk to Joseph Coolidge, jr., as a memorial of his affection. It was made from a drawing of his own by Ben. Randall, cabinet-maker, of Philadelphia, with whom he first lodged on his arrival in that city, in May, 1776, and is the identical one 011 which he wrote the Declaration of Independence.
